


Ministry of Human Resources Development launches 'School Nutrition Garden' Scheme

Farm2Food Foundation has been developing and implementing 'Farmpreneur—School Nutrition Garden' program since 2012. The program has benefitted more than 50,000 children across more than 500 schools in

Assam.

In 2017, we shared our model with Ministry of Human Resources Development at *Chintan Shivir*, New Delhi. MHRD has since launched 'School Nutrition Garden' for schools across the country. This is a moment of immense joy for all of us as it builds value for our model. We look forward to reaching to *1.2 million schools* across the country in the next 7 years through partnerships with various stakeholders.





Farmpreneur model awarded Bronze at ReImagine Education Award, USA

Farmpreneur model was shortlisted and ulitimately awarded a Bronze medal at the Reimagine Education Award. With over 1150 applications represented from across the globe, our model stood out under the Hybrid Learning Award. Owing to a lack of travel fund however, we were unabled to attend the final pitch in San Francisco, USA.

Two girls from our project field presented our work at the *Asia Pacific Democratic Education Conference 2018*, Bangaluru.


Two schools participated in the 'One day one story' campaign led by Pratham Books.

Our team members visited 'The Ant' at Chirang district to understand livelihood and science projects.



Our team member underwent training at the Goat Trust, Lucknow. Subsequently, we trained 30 women farmers. Women from several Self Help Groups came together to form the *goat rearing* group. About 1000 orange saplings were distributed among farmers of Golaghat as a part of the livelihood initiative. About 600 community members were oriented on issues connected with organic farming and nutrition.

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Change stories..



This year, several schools from our project area actively participated in science competitions / science fairs at the cluster, block and district levels organized by Dept of Education, Assam. This created the opportunity to interact with schools from a variety of spectrums including those from urban areas with access to resources. Three of our schools created an impact at the district level and were awarded prizes for their contribution and innovation. The experience demonstrated that levels of confidence and interest among students of science is rapidly growing. And continuing to

engage them in creative, sustainable ways is the need of the hour .

In the month of February 2019, Mothers group at Malowkhat village sold more than 2,100 kgs of vermicompost. Emergence of several Agri entrepreneurs in the region is a positive sign. They have adopted sustainable farming practices as well as kept a focus on their economic growth.

There are several such stories of hope and grit. Over the next few years, we would be creating more such stories across the country.



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
