

DIRECTOR'S REMARK



2020 was a year of shocking pause. Pandemic threw everything into a complete chaos. While we were trying to figure out our response to the new situation, we had to drop everything and get into relief mode. Our mass scale relief operation reached out to 500 villages. Annual flood in Assam was severe this year. We extended our relief support to the flood affected villages. We procured 400 kgs of vegetables from local farmers for relief distribution. This ensured that the local economy kept rolling. As well as nutrition requirements of marginalized communities were fulfilled to a certain extent. We provided training support to several families to kitchen gardens. These families had lost their livelihood opportunity due to the lockdown. Our engagement with young people were moved into online mode. We kept our eyes and ears on the ground by conducting regular need assessment and surveys. In these gloomy times, we found several new supporters this year. This warm support helped us sail through the difficult period. Overall, this year we recalibrated our approach to respond to the need of the hour.



Responses To Disaster

During the first phase of lockdown, Farm 2 Food has been able to reach out to more than 800 vulnerable families in the tea garden areas of the Jorhat & Golaghat district. More than 13 tons of food grains & 4 tons of vegetables procured from local farmers were distributed as a part of our relief operations.
